6. The Committee will not be responsible for any damage which may occur to exhibits or containers.
7. The Committee reserves the right to refuse any entry.
8. All prizes are to be awarded at the discretion of the Judges.
9. All arrangements to be at the discretion of the Committee.
10. All complaints must be made to the Secretary before 4.00 pm on the day of the Show. The decision of the Committee is final.
11. It shall be the duty of the Committee to see that no person except those officially appointed shall be present during the judging.
12. Prize money will be paid on the day of the show.
13. Class prizes and point scores as shown on previous page.
14. Arts and Craft items cannot be accepted for judging if they have been awarded a prize in any previous Spaxton Show.

## LEMON DRIZZLE CAKE RECIPE

$40 z$ soft margarine, $40 z$ caster sugar, Grated rind of 1 lemon, 2 eggs
$60 z$ self raising flour, 1-2 tablespoons of milk, For the topping: juice of 1 lemon, $20 z$ caster sugar
Method: Cream margarine, sugar and rind together. Gradually beat in the eggs with the flower and milk as needed. Place mixture in a greased and lined 2lb loaf tin. Place in pre headed oven 150deg C320 deg F, Gas mark 3 for 50-60 min.

Mix topping. Remove cake, leave in tin and pour over topping whilst the cake is still hot. Leave in tin until completely cool.
